Why this toolkit exists

Nationally, the median behaviour support plan scores in the weak range on the BSP-QEII, the twelve-item instrument the NDIS Commission uses to evaluate plans. Four in five plans sit in the underdeveloped or weak categories. The good news: the gap between a weak plan and a strong one is not talent. It is structure. These two tools are the fastest way to close it, and they are yours to keep.

Tool 1 · The BSP-QEII Self-Score Checklist

Score any plan you've written against the twelve items. Give each a 0, 1 or 2. A total of 17 or more (out of 24) places the plan in the Good to Superior range. The national median is 12. Anything you score 0 or 1 is your next edit.

1	Behaviour of concern	Observable, measurable; two staff would agree it occurred	
2	Predictors / triggers	Specific slow and fast triggers named	
3	What maintains it	Logically tied to the predictors	
4	Environmental change	Tied to what maintains the behaviour	
5	Predictors and function	The link between triggers and function is explicit	
6	Function and replacement	Replacement meets the same function	
7	Teaching strategies	How the replacement is actually taught	
8	Reinforcers	Specific and individualised, not "praise"	
9	Reactive strategies	Graduated, least restrictive, safety focused	
10	Goals and objectives	Measurable, with baseline and target	
11	Team coordination	Who does what, and how it stays coordinated	
12	Communication	How the plan is shared and kept live	
	TOTAL	Aim for 17 or more	

Tool 2 · Writing the functional impairment link

The single highest-value skill in NDIS documentation. Funding follows functional impact, not diagnosis. When the link from condition to daily-life impairment to specific support is implied rather than shown, plans and funding requests get questioned. Show the chain and they hold up.

The move: from diagnosis-led to function-led

Weak (diagnosis-led)	Strong (function-led)
"The participant has autism and requires support."	"Autism substantially reduces communication and self-management capacity; the participant cannot signal distress or wait for a preferred item, which presents as property damage. Support: communication partner training and a functional communication system."

The five-part chain to write every time

- The condition or diagnosis.
- The functional domain it impairs (mobility, communication, social interaction, learning, self-care, self-management).
- How that shows up in ordinary daily life, with a concrete example.
- How it links to the behaviour of concern.
- The reasonable and necessary support that follows.

KEEP THIS

If you can write those five parts for every recommended support, your funding justification is already stronger than most plans the Commission sees.
